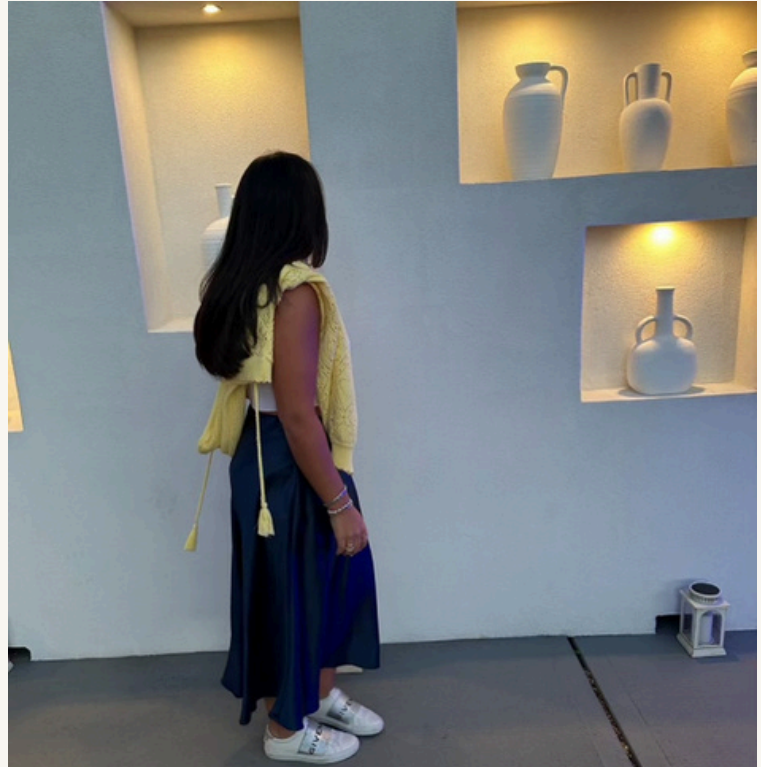

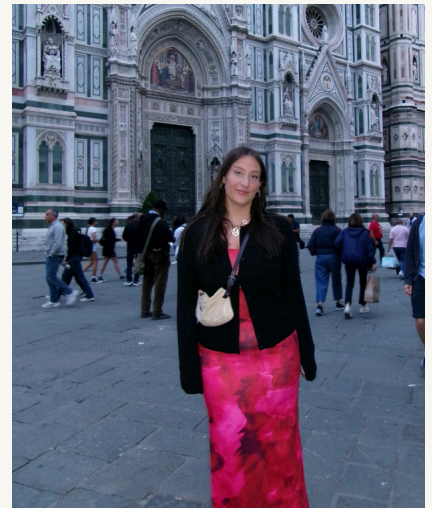


INTERNSHIP INTRODUCTIONS

WHY AEPHI?

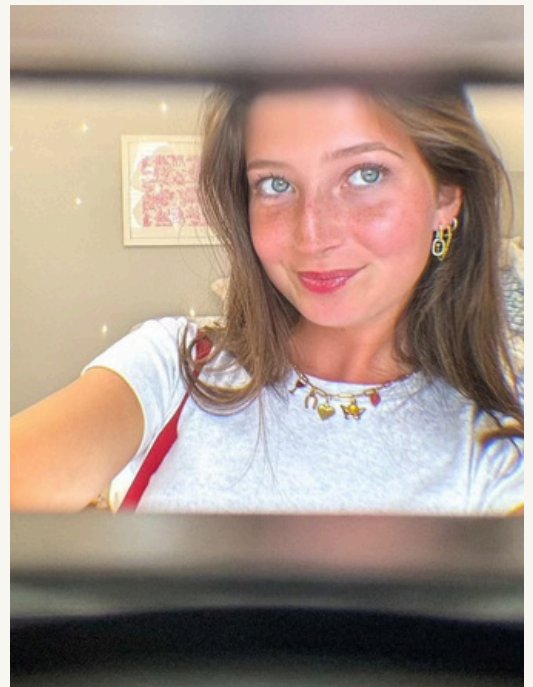
